VEDOVA, EMILIO

Vedova was born in Venice in 1919, and began exhibiting his work in 1935. Vedova has exhibited at the Venice Biennial where he has received several important prizes such as the "Dufy Prize" in 1952, the Volpe Prize in 1950, and the Grand Prize in 1960. He also represented Italy at the San Paulo Bienal (1951) in Brazil, where he won the Morganti Prize. In 1956 he was awarded the Guggenheim International Prize. Essentially self-taught, Vedova started as a figural expressionists, then moved through a geometric phase after World War 11, and finally to abstract expressionism, establishing an international reputation.
